15 of our 25 Staff graduated from the program!

Union Gospel Mission Sacramento is a 501(c)(3) voluntary Christian organization, Federal Tax ID No. 94-6103618. We provide Christ-centered spiritual and social services to needy individuals, bringing dignity to broken lives, giving them hope and an opportunity for transformation. The Mission operates without tax or government support of any kind, funded entirely by the generous donations of individuals and organizations.

We provide daily meals to approximately 9,000 men, women and children per month. Our services include daily showers, fresh toiletry products, mail, lockers, clothing, shoes, many essential items, haircuts, and overnight accommodations for 60 homeless and 24 men in the recovery program. Bi-weekly and for special holidays, we also hand out food boxes to families in need.

The Mission's goal is to break the grip of addiction, provide vocational training, and return men as productive members to society through the teaching of God's Word. Our 9-month in-house rehabilitation program for up to 24 men at any given time, is intensive. Participants are provided Christian based classes, counseling, mentorship, chapel service, meals, medical assistance, transportation, housing, and all other daily needs.

Our Women's Clothing Closet is open every Thursday, to help homeless women and the working poor in our community who struggle to live decent lives and make ends meet. The morning starts off with a bible study, and then a spree of clothing, shoes, toiletries, hygiene products, and a variety of essential items. The staff and volunteers are eager to show them the love of Jesus!

In fact, none of the items, food, and services provided by the Mission requires a fee or payment of any kind.

For more than 50 years, Union Gospel Mission Sacramento has been bringing mercy, clothing, food, shelter, spiritual training, and recovery to Sacramento's urban poor. We strive to be good stewards of the trust our donors and supporters place in us.
