

# Shines Bright

Lat a Mission like this," says Jeremy Gaulthier, the 41-year-old Operations Manager and Lead Chaplain at the Union Gospel Mission. "God used everything in my life to shape me into the man I am today."

Like many men at the Mission, Jeremy grew up in a troubled home. He started using drugs and alcohol at age 12 and spent 20 years trapped in addiction. He ended up homeless on the streets until God transformed his life at a shelter run by a church.

"They showed me a kind of life I'd never seen before," he says. "They were so loving and gentle, and I wanted that."

Shortly after Jeremy was saved, he began serving, replacing old habits that served himself to serving others and the local church. Later, he went to seminary, and in January 2022, he started serving as chaplain at the Mission.

"I was hired to reform the program and replace their AA and 12-step model with a biblical one. We desire to see the gospel transform lives from the inside out, train biblically, and then send them back into their communities and a local church prepared for life."

One of Jeremy's newest efforts is launching Redemption House, a residential home in downtown Sacramento to provide extended care for men after they graduate from the Mission's program.

"We desire to see the gospel transform lives from the inside out, train biblically, and then send them back into their communities and a local church prepared for life."

"It will give them a safe, rent-free place to land after they leave, where they can continue growing in their faith and reach for their goals," Jeremy says. "At the same time, it's a place where local churches can come alongside them, mentor them, disciple them, and get them involved in their churches."

This Christmas, thanks to generous support from friends like you, the Mission will continue to share the hope of Christ with even more people in our community. "Redemption House, and the men we serve there, is truly the light of the Gospel shining bright in downtown Sacramento."
